

## **Manuscript Withdrawal Policy**

Authors occasionally may find it necessary to withdraw a submitted manuscript from consideration for publication. MedPulse Spectrum understands and accommodates such situations. The following guidelines outline the process and conditions for manuscript withdrawal:

- 1. **Request for Withdrawal:** Authors must formally request the withdrawal of their manuscript by contacting the editorial office via email. The request should come from the corresponding author and include the reasons for withdrawal.

- 5. **Publication Status:** Withdrawn manuscripts will not be published by MedPulse Spectrum. Any information related to the withdrawn manuscript will be removed from public access.
- 6. **Resubmission Option:** Authors have the option to revise and resubmit the withdrawn manuscript if they wish to reconsider it for publication. The resubmission will undergo the standard submission and peer-review process.
